**WEATHER FORECAST**

**DATE: WEDNESDAY 21<sup>ST</sup> MAY, 2025**

**TONIGHT:** Stable atmosphere will prevail over the country during the period.

**TOMORROW:** Slight haze and occasionally breezy atmospheric conditions is expected to prevail in the early morning, becoming sunny and hot during the day.

**WINDS:** Will vary between westerly and southwesterly flow with speed ranging from 10-26km/h.

**TEMPERATURES:** The lowest minimum value is expected to drop to 21°C over the North Bank Region whereas; maximum value is expected to reach 40°C over Upper River Region.

**SUNRISE AND SUNSET:** The sun is expected to rise over Upper River Region at 06:29AM and over Greater Banjul at 06:39AM, and will set at 07:17 PM and 07:27 PM over Greater Banjul and Upper River Region.
